Blessing of the Throats - The Feast of Saint Blaise

Saint Blaise noted for his special care of throats, will be celebrated on Wednesday, February 3rd here at St. Mary Magdalene during the 7 p.m. Mass.

St. Blaise was a medical doctor and also a Bishop of Sebastea in Armenia during the 4th century. He was persecuted for his faith and was told, in a message from God, to go into the hills to escape the persecution of Licinius. In the hills, he lived as a hermit in prayer and solitude, befriending the wild animals, curing them of their illnesses as they lived with him in a cave. Upon his capture, St. Blaise was being returned for trial when a woman stopped him accompanied by her son who was choking to death on a fish bone. She asked his help and he immediately cured the child. Ever since, St. Blaise has been acknowledged as the patron saint of those who have throat maladies as well as the patron saint of wild animals.

During the Blessing of Throats, two blessed candles are held against the throat in a cross and a special prayer is recited. "Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other disease." Amen.

HEALTHCARE REFORM

A MESSAGE FROM THE U.S. BISHOPS

Congress continues to debate health care reform. While the House passed a health care bill that prevents the federal government from funding elective abortions, and includes provisions making health care affordable and accessible for all, the Senate rejected this and passed a bill that requires federal funds to help subsidize and promote health plans that cover elective abortions, while forcing purchasers to pay directly for other people's abortions. These two bills must now be combined into one bill that both the House and Senate will vote on in final form.

The U.S. bishops continue to strongly oppose abortion funding, while calling for critical improvements in conscience protection, affordability for the poor and vulnerable, and access to health care for immigrants.

Located in the narthex you'll find a flier from the U.S. Bishops Conference asking you to please contact your congressional representatives immediately and urge them to address these moral issues. The flier includes a web address that allows you to send an email message to Congress with a click of a button. The bishops have asked for our swift action and our prayers. Thank you for your help. We can help make sure that health care reform will protect the lives, dignity, conscience and health of all. Health care reform should be about saving lives, not destroying them.
