NEW HANDICAPPED PARKING GUIDELINES

It has come to the attention of the Pastoral Advisory Council (PAC) that the number of people authorized to park in the designated handicapped parking spaces has increased within our parish – including many with severe handicaps that require the use of wheelchairs and other mobility devices. This has resulted in additional handicapped spaces being added, then an access ramp to better facilitate the approach to our main entrance.

We ask that if you are “permitted” to use a handicapped parking spot, but are not severely impaired, that you please use the spaces across from the entrance walkway and reserve the blue striped spaces for our severely handicapped parishioners. If you need assistance getting from your car to the narthex, you are encouraged to use our golf cart service.
