


## **STEWARDSHIP**

### A Chance of a Lifetime

"Although there were thousands on the lawn, you could have heard a pin drop as Pope Francis delivered his first words."

After two months, I'm still almost speechless when someone asks about our trip to see the Pope! As one young priest we met while waiting for our train to the airport said, "this was the chance of a lifetime." I suppose those are some of the best words to describe our experience.

At about 8:00 p.m. on Monday, September 21, I received a text from a good friend who is also Catholic and lives in Newnan. The text read "I put in for 4 tickets to see the Pope on Thursday in DC with Congressman Westmoreland and got them! Unfortunately I can't make it happen. Before I decline them, are you interested?" My immediate response was "Oh my gosh.....let me check!!!" I immediately went through my list of things I had to do during the remainder of the week and realized I had some pretty important commitments, then I thought ... wait, this is the Pope – clear your schedule! Thanks to the Holy Spirit, my husband, and Toni Egan, by Tuesday at 7:30 p.m. Hannah, Hayden and I were headed to D.C. to see Pope Francis!

On Wednesday evening, the three of us were joined by Elizabeth Egan, who took a train to D.C. from NYC. We did some sightseeing and then returned to our hotel for a short night's sleep. We were up at 5:00 a.m. to join thousands of others on the lawn of Capitol Hill. Security and smiles were ample and all in D.C. were a buzz about the Pope being in town. As we waited on the lawn, we made acquaintance with those near us, including Fr. Christiano a priest at St. Anthony's in Cambridge, MA, and Aaron, a civil engineer from IL. Although there were thousands on the lawn, you could have heard a pin drop as Pope Francis delivered his first words. I was furiously trying to capture his message in the "notes" of my iPhone and quickly realized, I needed to be present to the moment and enjoy it – I knew I could find the speeches for years to come on various sites online.

Of the few things I did capture, here are the three that struck me. "It is hard to judge the past with criteria of the future", "Treat others with passion and compassion." and "Protect human life at every stage of development. Every life is sacred". At the conclusion of Pope Francis' blessing from the balcony, we all just stood there clapping and cheering, almost as if we were at a concert, hoping for an encore – when we realized it was really over, Fr. Christiano gave Hannah a special blessing and said he would pray for her as she was preparing for the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion and Aaron had a huge smile on his face as he said, "this has got to be the best day of my life!"

Often, I find myself in a position where I need to defend my faith or I find the need to share ways to defend our faith with my children or children in our formation programs, but for this 24-hour period in DC, even our taxi driver wished he was Catholic!" In a time when there is so much that divides our country, particularly, in our nation's capital, it was nice to see one holy man, pull everyone together! So, yes, as the young priest we met while waiting for our train said, "This was a chance of a lifetime!"

-Pope Francis' homily at July 6th, 2015 at Mass at Samanes Park in Guayaquil






