


#8. Stewardship - servant-leadership, like stewardship, assumes first and foremost a commitment to serving the needs of others. It also emphasizes the use of openness and persuasion, rather than control.

#10. Building community - servant-leadership suggests that true community can be created among those who work in businesses and other institutions.

Servant-leadership characteristics often occur naturally within many individuals; and, like many natural tendencies, they can be enhanced through learning and practice. Servant-leadership offers great hope for the future in creating better, more caring, institutions.

Adoration Guardians Needed

Nikki Walick, who has heroically run St. Mary Magdalene's adoration ministry for many years, is stepping back in her administrative role. We're so grateful for her long service and tremendously blessed that she intends to remain heavily involved in the adoration schedule, but I'll now be handling the administrative aspect of the ministry.

Currently, the parish offers regular, weekly adoration of the Blessed Sacrament each Thursday from 4-7pm, as well as after Mass on Fridays. Each first Friday, the parish offers adoration from 6-8pm, during which Fr. Revak hears about an hour of confessions.

You might've noticed, given the increasing parking space scarcity, that the parish is growing. It is! We've now got more than 1,600 registered families. But... we only have 15 registered adoration guardians for the Blessed Sacrament. We need you!

All it takes to be a guardian is to commit to sitting with Jesus for one hour of the 200+ we offer each year. That's it! And that gift of an hour of your time can make a huge difference, especially if replicated widely across the parish. Maybe God is even calling you to regularly spend time with Him in adoration -- maybe on a quarterly, monthly, or even weekly basis! Pray about it.

Every hour of exposition requires at least two guardians present with our Lord. We need you, and we'd love to increase our exposition time as the ministry grows. So consider, as well, what hours you might dedicate in the future if needed. Imagine, there are parishes that expose continuously!

I've got a loud house, so I'm limited in answering phone calls, but I'm very accessible via text and email. I'm eager to hear from you. We're looking for commitments to spend one hour with Jesus each Thursday from 4-7pm and each first Friday from 6-8pm.

The parish needs your time. The world needs your prayers.
