Advent means "to come". It encompasses 4 Sundays and weeks leading up to Christmas. The focus of Advent is to help us prepare for Christ coming at Christmas. With all the hustle and bustle of the Christmas season, we need to remember to prepare our hearts for Christ coming. We do this with prayers, reflections, daily reading of scripture or a good spiritual book. We can also try to go to at least one Mass during the week or go to confession. Doing acts of service helps us keep our focus of the true meaning of Christmas as we prepare our hearts and homes to celebrate the birth of Christ. Everything we do can be made into a prayer and reflection; from putting up an Advent wreath and calendar to baking cookies with family and friends to putting up a tree. Some feast days during Advent help us focus on the "why" we prepare for Christ.

December 6th is the Feast of St. Nicolas

December 13th is the Feast of St. Lucy

#### Ten Characteristics of A Servant-Leader

In previous articles, we have shared with you four characteristics of a servant-leader as defined in the National Council of Catholic Women (CCW). They were #1 thru #4, Listening, Empathy, Healing and Awareness. This month we are sharing #5 Persuasion, #6 Conceptualization and #7 Foresight.

#5. Persuasion - the servant-leader seeks to convince others rather than coerce compliance.

#6. Conceptualization - a servant-leader seeks to nurture their abilities to dream great dreams. Servant-leaders are called to seek a delicate balance between conceptual thinking and a day-to-day operational approach.

#7. Foresight - a characteristic that enables the servant-leader to understand the lessons from the past, the realities of the present, and the likely consequence of a decision for the future.

This is the Divine Mercy Jesus painting we see showing Jesus with one hand on his heart and one hand raised up as in a blessing, with white and red rays emanating from His heart. At our luncheon, each member was given a prayer card with the Chaplet of Divine Mercy and we also spoke about the Divine Mercy Novena.
