

Adult Confirmation 2011

Adults age 19 and older

Formation sessions January 9 – February 20 Sunday 10:15am – 11:45am Sacrament will be celebrated March 5th, 2011 5pm

Following the Archdiocesan guidelines of Atlanta formation for adults is free standing, of brief duration, intensely focused Confirmation preparation for catechized adults who have never been confirmed but who have celebrated Baptism, Reconciliation and Eucharist. Adults will be confirmed at the local church when the Archbishop or Auxiliary Bishop presides at the celebration.

Week 1 - Gods call and our response: Catechism nos. 1-3, 50-73, 142-184.

Revelation Scripture, Tradition and the Magisterium, general familiarity with and ability to use the Bible and Catechism as well as an understanding of the Creed. CCC 74-141, 185-1065, focus on the 12 Articles of the Creed, Triune God, Incarnation Pascal Mystery, Pentecost and Church. Resources: Mark Link #3 and #2 (January 9, 2011)

Week 2 – Structure and content of the Mass, overview of Sacraments, ability to use Missal, understanding of the other Sacraments and their place in the stages of Christian life. CCC1210 Resources: Mark Link #20, 21, 17 (January 16, 2011)

Week 3 – Review and Update on Catholic morality and a mature examination of the Sacrament of Penance

ADULT CONFIRMATION

St. Mary Magdalene Confirmation preparation program is designed to help you come to a deeper understanding of how the Holy Spirit works in your life and in the life of the Church.

<u>Learning Sessions</u> Each candidate attends seven formation sessions classes. Sponsors are invited to attend sessions with you.

<u>Confirmation Name</u> Candidates must choose a Confirmation name. This can be your baptismal name or the name of a Saint you admire. Candidates will research their Confirmation name and write a brief summary explaining why they chose their particular name and how it represents them.

<u>Retreat Experience Candidates</u> are encouraged to participate in a retreat to spend time in reflection and prayer. The Ignatius House, a Jesuit Retreat Center in Atlanta and the Monastery of the Holy Spirit in Conyers Georgia are wonderful retreat locations.
