



Week 1 – Gods call and our response, revelation Scripture, Tradition and the magisterium, general familiarity with and ability to use the bible and catechism as well as an understanding of the Creed. focus on the 12 Articles of the Creed, Triune God, Incarnation Pascal Mystery, Pentecost and Church.

Week 2 – Structure and content of the Mass, overview of Sacraments, ability to and their place in the stages of Christian life.

Week 3 – Review and Update on Catholic morality and a mature examination of the Sacrament of Penance

Week 4 – Continuation of discussion on Catholic morality and the material from previous session

Week 5 – Prayer and Spirituality

Week 6 – Gifts and Fruits of the Holy Spirit, which flow from Baptism and Confirmation.

Week 7 – Open for discussion of points of interest or concern in preparation for the Celebration of Confirmation


